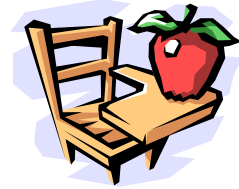
A Summer Econ Ed Workshop for K-12 Teachers

What: A graduate credit course in economic education for K-12 teachers.

The Program: The workshop is designed for *elementary and secondary* teachers. Instruction will be provided on economic concepts, current economic issues, financial literacy, and a broad overview of instructional methods, materials, and simulations that can be used to present these concepts to students. *The workshop will definitely help K-8 teachers prepare students for the Social Studies ISTEP⁺ test!*

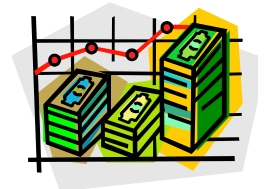
The workshop will consist of lectures, group discussions, and group activities. Participants will use games and simulations to increase their own levels of economic understanding, and will also examine economic education materials. *Economic curriculum booklets and posters, and other economic education materials, will be given to participants.*

A curriculum unit covering at least five lessons is required and is expected to focus on how participants plan to actually teach economics to their own students in the upcoming school year.

No formal background in economics is required, and no one should refrain from applying because he or she fears that the material covered in the workshop will be too difficult. Teachers and administrators in public, private, and parochial schools are encouraged to apply, and applications are welcomed from school personnel at all grade levels and in all subject areas.
